Q&A

I can't make this meeting, can I attend future ones? Yes absolutely, you don't need to attend every session either, how often you attend if completely up to you.

I may be late, do I have to arrive exactly at 3pm? No, you can arrive at any time between 3-5pm, it will be ok for you enter whilst the group is in progress, this is completely 100% fine ②. You can also leave at any time you wish.

Are you allowed to eat or drink in this room?

Yes you are. In fact it is one of the reasons why we meet in this venue. We just ask that you tidy up and put any rubbish in the bin after the event.

How many people are coming? Usually its between 5-15

Can I bring a friend with me or my Specialist Mentor? Yes absolutely, the group welcomes everybody, including neuro-typicals. They can stay for the whole time or leave at any time.

I know a student who is Autistic or suspects they are Autistic, but they haven't registered with the University Disability Team or have a formal diagnosis—can they come? Yes. You do not have to be registered with the Disability Team or be formally diagnosed to attend the group. If the student would like some advice, I am happy for them to contact me as well to see how we can assist them.

In this inclusive environment, you can come along and sit and listen, or join in with the conversation, most students just sit and talk, but some may bring board games with them.
